Our Assessments

DV-ACT can provide a number of expert assessments which can be produced at any stage, including cases in proceedings. The following information gives brief details of what each assessment includes; however, our assessors are highly qualified and can answer further questions if required.

Preliminary Report

Where there is an urgent need for an overview of risks prior to a full report being completed, this report will provide an outline of static risk/vulnerability factors and an indication of dynamic factors giving an early view on treatment suitability and prognosis for change.

Vulnerability Assessment of Victim/Survivor

Alongside identifying vulnerability to future abuse, the impact of the abuse on the victim's parenting will also be assessed, including:

- The mother's background including previous exposure to abuse;
- History of abuse in the current relationship and impact on children;
- Ability to assess risk and prioritise safety;
- Recommendations for treatment and risk management options.

Risk Assessment

Assesses the risks to the victim and children from the perpetrator. The report will include:

- Static risk indicators (such as lethality, use of weapons & history of violence);
- Dynamic risk factors (such as denial, remorse & victim empathy);
- History of DV & impact on the children;
- Likelihood of further exposure of the children to violence;
- Prognosis for treatment;
- Risk management plan.

Joint Risk & Vulnerability Assessment

An assessment of both parents including all the elements of risk and vulnerability assessments, but also:

- A clear picture of the dynamics of the relationship;
- the likelihood of separation/reconciliation;
- particular safeguarding issues raised by the parental relationship



Child Contact Proceedings

A risk assessment of perpetrators can be provided for cases where child contact is being considered. These assessments are suitable for all cases in private law proceedings regardless of local authority involvement. The assessment will include a risk assessment report that can be used in court proceedings, with the assessor attending court as an expert witness where necessary.



Other Domestic Abuse Assessments
